
# VISIT Kerang


Kerang is a picturesque town located on the banks of the Loddon River. The regional service centre offers an attractive landscaped shopping precinct including major supermarket chains, hotels, cafes and many specialty stores and businesses.



#### **MUST DO:**

- Explore Kerang Regional Park via the Loddon River Walk on the edge of town. The
  popular riverside walk offers natural wetlands and vibrant birdlife.
- Enjoy a peaceful afternoon fishing for Yellow Belly or kayak the Loddon River. Access
  the river from the kayak launch facility within Kerang Regional Park. The park is
  accessible for vehicles from the western end of Wyndham or North streets.
- Visit Kerang Lakes, popular for watersports, fishing, kayaking and birdwatching.
- Choose from a range of cafes and country pubs, with great outdoor dining and beer gardens. Treat yourself to coffee and freshly made pastries at Gray's Bakery while the kids enjoy the indoor play centre.
- Cool down at the Kerang Splash Park and Swimming Pool between November and March. Keep an eye out for special events and activities over the summer holidays.
- Enjoy the modern all abilities adventure playground, skate park and barbecue facilities
  with family and friends at Atkinson Park. Free WiFi is available near the skate park.
- Visit **Sir John Gorton Library**, a great local resource providing free WiFi, computers with internet access, visitor information, family history research and exhibition displays.
- Climb the historic Lester Smith Lookout Tower built in 1883 and be greeted with elevated views of the town, Loddon River and Kerang Lakes on the horizon. Access the key via the Sir John Gorton Library.
- Immerse yourself in Kerang's history at the Kerang Historical Society and Museum or wander through town with the Self-guided Walk or Drive of Historic Kerang brochure.
- Drop into Shepo's Whey A dairy farm with a twist! View sculptures from recycled tools and pieces of machinery.
- Be part of the worldwide phenomenon and participate in Kerang parkrun; meeting at the town levee at the west end of Wyndham Street each Saturday at 8am.
- Drive by Gannawarra Solar Farm, Victoria's first large-scale solar farm, and Australia's largest integrated solar and battery facility, located 12km east of Kerang.
- Join the excitement of the Kerang Races held on Easter Saturday, and in late December.
- Kerang hosts many events that capture the essence of the community and visitors alike including art performances, community markets, New Year's Eve Party in the Park, Kerang Show and Shine, Rotary Art Show and sporting tournaments.





# VISIT Cohuna

Cohuna is one of the prettiest towns along the Murray with the township and shopping precinct adjacent to the Gunbower Creek.

#### **MUST DO:**


- Enjoy a swim or build sandcastles along the sandy shores of **Cohuna Beach** located at Apex Park. The park also features an all-abilities adventure playground, impressive skate park and modern barbecue facilities.
- **Browse** specialty stores or **dine** at local eateries including the Bower Tavern, Kimmy's Cafe and The Big Cohuna ice-cream cafe, which is popular with local and visiting families all year round.
- Jens on George is a must visit while in Cohuna, known for its great atmosphere, waffles, burgers and beer.
- Cohuna is the gateway to **Gunbower Island**, the perfect location for fishing, camping, kayaking and outdoor recreation.
- Get your adrenalin pumping at Cohuna Ski Run! Located along Island Road on the Gunbower Creek, the ski run is a popular location for action watersports.
- Enjoy a guided eco kayak experience with Murray River Adventures or take a self-guided tour along the **Gunbower Creek**.
- Hire a free mountain bike from the Gateway to Gannawarra Visitor Centre and ride along the scenic Gunbower Island Road walking and bike track.
- Visit Cohuna RSL Memorial Park featuring honour roll, memorial statues and a mural painted by artist, Tim Bowtell.
- Participate in Cohuna parkrun who meet in Garden Park at 8am each Saturday.
- Play the home course of Australian professional golfer, Stuart Appleby. The extraordinary fairways and greens of the Cohuna Golf and Bowls Club have been carved out of the Gunbower Forest along the Gunbower Creek.
- Wake up to sunrise views from the deck of your waterfront cabin at the family friendly Cohuna Waterfront Holiday Park.
- Cool down at the **Cohuna Swimming Pool** and waterslide over summer.
- The **Cohuna Art Gallery** presents a diverse exhibition program each year and houses Rock 'n Roll memorabilia honouring Cohuna as the launching place for many iconic music industry names including John Farnham and the Bee Gees.
- Featuring a Museum, Archives Centre and Trash and Treasure Hall, the Cohuna **Historical Society** is a treasured resource for locals, visitors and historians alike.
- Cohuna hosts many events throughout the year including Cohuna agricultural show, New Year's Eve carnival, Big Cohuna Festival, sporting events and monthly farmers and maker's market.

# VISIT Koondrook

Koondrook is a historic Murray River village where paddle steamers and river transport were a hive of activity in the early 1900s. Today Koondrook is a growing town supported by a strong tourism sector from the Gunbower Island and Murray River.

#### MUST DO:

- Visit the **Koondrook Waterfront** incorporating the award-winning wharf, meticulously restored Goods Shed, history information signs, all abilities playground and landscaped walking path linking to Koondrook Retreat.
- Wander across the red gum footbridge along the Goanna Walking Track; a 3.2km walking loop through the Gunbower Forest via Condidorio's Bridge.
- Book a unique glamping and nature experience at Koondrook Retreat. Enjoy unspoiled views of the creek and forest from your luxury self-contained safari tent.
- Enjoy a gourmet breakfast or lunch at the **Long Paddock Food Store**.
- Relax in the outdoor beer garden, or dine in the distinctive indoor bar and lounge, decorated with local memorabilia and taxidermy at Mate's Royal Hotel.
- Indulge in a day spa treatment at **Skin Essence**.
- Drop into Form Athletic for fitness, health and wellness. Try nutrient dense smoothies or relax in the infrared sauna.
- Nestled on the final bend of the Gunbower Creek before it re-enters the Murray River sits Murray Waters Motor Inn and Apartments and Koondrook Caravan Park, offering accommodation with riverfront views close to the centre of town.
- Echoing across the quiet town for more than 130 years are the working blades of Arbuthnot Sawmills. Stroll along the walking track that passes through the work yard or make a group booking to view milling operations from an elevated platform.
- Walk across the historic Barham-Koondrook Bridge, one of the oldest lift span bridges on the Murray River, built in 1904.
- Follow the history of the timber industry on the Koondrook Barham Redgum Statue River Walk along the Murray River, and discover magnificent red gum sculptures, carved by chainsaw, depicting local identities and native wildlife.
- Find the Eagle Tree along the Koondrook Red Gum Forest Walk. The heritage listed River Red Gum sits more than 50 metres into the forest canopy and was named due to a Sea Eagle's nest built high in the crown.
- Cool down at the Koondrook Swimming Pool over summer.




The internationally recognised Koondrook Wharf was

constructed in 2016 in recognition

of the old wharf that once serviced

the paddle steamer trade. Leading to the wharf's entrance lays an old tram

turntable, which has been resurfaced with red gum, slate and basalt artworks



## VISIT Murrabit

Murrabit is a small country town situated north of Kerang and in close proximity to the Murray River. The natural bush setting along the river attracts visitors for camping, boating and fishing.

#### **MUST DO:**

- Join the hundreds of eager shoppers on the first Saturday of each month at the Murrabit Country Market, one of Victoria's longest running markets, operating since 1977. Be sure to check out the brightly coloured murals depicting native flora and wildlife by Paul Oswin.
- Visit the Murrabit Bridge, the first all steel bridge over the Murray River between New South Wales and Victoria. Constructed in 1926, the bridge remains in operation today and its lift span is utilised a number of times per year, to allow passage of large vessels and paddle steamers.
- Enjoy a picnic at Miss Keats Picnic Park, an excellent location to view the bridge and river. Miss M.G. Keats MBE, a Murrabit local, was the first woman to graduate with a Bachelor of Veterinary Science from the University of Melbourne in 1923.
- The iconic Murray River is just 2km from town, and anglers travel up or downstream of the Murrabit Bridge to catch Murray Cod and Yellow Belly. Boats can be launched at the modern concrete boat ramp just downstream of the bridge.
- Enter the Murrabit Cod Challenge fishing competition held in March.
- Discover the history of Murrabit and district at the purpose-built Murrabit Heritage **Shelter** at the community park or enjoy the playground and barbecue facilities.
- Try a round of golf on the 13-hole course with sandscrape greens. The Murrabit Golf Course is open through the cooler months and welcomes new players.
- Join in the relaxed competition of the annual Easter tennis tournament hosted by the Murrabit Lawn Tennis Club for over 70 years.
- Experience local football and netball at the Murrabit Recreation Reserve and try a traditional piping hot pie or hot dog to get you through a wintery Saturday afternoon.



# visit Quambatook and the Mallee

The Mallee offers vast landscapes, clear night skies and has long been known for its dryland cropping and grain growing capacity. Nestled in the Mallee is Quambatook, a quaint rural town known for being the childhood home of John Williamson and Molly Meldrum, two of the most influential and well-known names in Australian music.

#### MUST DO:

- The Quambatook Silo Cinema is a unique, community run cinema which attracts many visitors to Quambatook. Old grain silos positioned in the centre of town become a big screen showcasing great Aussie films such as The Dressmaker (partly filmed in the Mallee), The Castle, Crocodile Dundee and The Adventures of Priscilla, Queen of the Desert.
- Quambatook has been recognised as the tractor pulling capital of Australia with the Australian Tractor Pull Championships held annually on Easter Saturday since 1976.
- Check out the Quambatook Heritage Machinery Display that takes place over the Australia Day weekend annually.
- Kayak or fish the Avoca River and Quambatook Weir or enjoy a leisurely stroll along the Avoca River Levee Walk.
- Enjoy a **picnic** under the well-loved peppercorn trees in the centre of Quambatook.
- Swim at the Quambatook Swimming Pool over summer.
- Seek treasures at the Quambatook and District Share Shop, a not-for-profit share shop showcasing antiques, collectables and handmade items from small businesses across the district.
- Visit the Quambatook Historical Centre and John Williamson Museum, the gathering place for local history, and a celebration of the town and the people of "Quamby."
- Visit Lalbert, positioned in the heart of the Mallee's wheat growing area. Lalbert was named in 1836 by Major Mitchell with the name thought to derive from the Aboriginal name of a creeper that grew on Mallee trees. Lake Lalbert, only 2kms from town, is a flood-filled lake and a significant environmental showpiece when in flood.







# VISIT Leitchville

Leitchville is an agricultural community with strong links to the dairy industry, located just off the Murray Valley Highway between Echuca and Cohuna. The town is only a short drive to Kow Swamp, Gunbower Island and the Murray River.

#### **MUST DO:**

- Enjoy country hospitality at the **Leitchville Hotel** and **Redgum Bakery**.
- Stock up on road trip or camping supplies at IGA X-press, The Good Meat Co, Leitchville Post Office, Baker & Sons Hardware and Leitchville Drapery.
- For self-contained RV stopovers, stay at the landscaped Traveller's Rest area, perfectly located for exploring the town and its surrounds.
- Cool off at the **Leitchville Swimming Pool** during the warmer months.
- Take a short drive to **Gunbower Island**, a great spot for kayaking, fishing and camping on the Murray River or Gunbower Creek.
- Experience Kow Swamp, a large natural wetland located just 2.5kms south of Leitchville. The name Kow Swamp is derived from an Aboriginal word in the Yorta Yorta language, Ghow, which refers to the white gypsum soil found in the area. Aboriginal occupation is evident from scar trees and shell middens, while early settlers' records describe an Aboriginal ceremonial site. The burial ground is considered one of the world's largest single populations of human remains from the late Pleistocene era. Kow Swamp is now an important water storage in the Torrumbarry Irrigation System, and is a great place for fishing, kayaking and picnicking. Lions Park at Kow Swamp offers great photo opportunities with magnificent sunset and night sky views.

Climb nearby **Mount Hope** and be rewarded with vast views of Kow Swamp, farmland, clear horizons and Mount Hope Station where explorers Burke and Wills stayed during their 1860 expedition.

- Drive past the 34MW Cohuna Solar Farm located on the Leitchville-Kerang Road, capable of producing 77GWh of clean energy per year.
- Leitchville hosts many events throughout the year including Australia Day celebrations, ANZAC Day service and a Biggest Morning Tea event.




# VISIT Lake Charm and Mystic Park

The rural communities of Lake Charm and Mystic Park (Kangaroo Lake) are located between Kerang and Swan Hill and are supported by agriculture and a strong tourism sector. Lake Charm and Kangaroo Lake are both large freshwater lakes, popular for watersports and recreational activities including photography, birdwatching, walking and cycling.

#### MUST DO:

- Visit the Mystic Park Hotel for warm hospitality, great food and entertainment.
- Kangaroo Lake is the former home of the 19th Australian Prime Minister, Sir John Gorton. Take a drive along scenic Gorton Drive past one of Victoria's larger vineyards, owned by the renowned Brown Brothers. Local vignerons, the Dent family are also producing fine wines in the area under the label Countertop Wines.
- The Kangaroo Lake Foreshore offers a boat ramp, barbecue and toilet facilities, and is a great place to spend the day lakeside with family and friends.
- Look out for the artistic murals of Paul Oswin at Lake Charm, and Chuck Mayfield and Bryan Itch at Kangaroo Lake Caravan Park.
- Kangaroo Lake Caravan Park offers a variety of accommodation options, along with a relaxed and inviting atmosphere. The park's licensed kiosk offers grocery lines, petrol, hot and cold drinks, their famous pizzas and plenty more.
- Along the highway at Lake Charm you will find Lake Charm General Store and Caravan Park, offering takeaway food, supermarket supplies, fuel and a post office.
- Two parks can be found on the Lake Charm foreshore. Pelican Waters Tourist Park boasts absolute lake frontage, and offers a licensed kiosk, while Lake Charm Foreshore **Caravan Park** provides grassy shores and tranquil water views.
- Rest and rejuvenate at the lakeside Airbnb's. Reconnect with nature, experience farm life, paddle in the lake or laze by the pool at **Charm Lodge** or enjoy the private setting and direct lake access at Pleasance Views.
- Experience the adrenalin of the Victorian Ski Racing titles and various powered boat races at Lake Charm and Kangaroo Lake.
- Fishing is popular at the lakes, with Redfin, and Yellow Belly regular catches. In Spring, enter the **Redfin Fishing Classic** at Lake Charm, which attracts hundreds of anglers.







# CLOSE TO NATURE Kerang Lakes

The Kerang Lakes compromises of 23 named lakes, marshes and swamps on the lower reaches of the Avoca and Loddon rivers. The lakes are recognised as wetlands of international significance under the Ramsar Convention and provide important feeding and breeding grounds for a large number of local and migratory waterbirds. Aboriginal people have a strong connection to the Kerang Lakes and wetlands with cooking mounds, shell middens and scar trees evidence of their long occupation of this land by their ancestors.

Lake Charm and Kangaroo Lake are key destinations with locals and visitors alike for powered watersports, swimming, fishing, kayaking and birdwatching. Both lakes are important permanent water storages in the Torrumbarry Irrigation System.

Lake Meran, located on the northern edge of Leaghur Forest, is a picturesque freshwater lake subject to seasonal fluctuations. The white sandy shores of Lake Meran provide lovely spots to camp, swim, fish or simply relax with a picnic in the natural red gum surrounds. When water levels permit the lake is suitable for powered watersports.

The three Reedy Lakes are natural wetlands that were incorporated into the irrigation supply system over 100 years ago. They are all similar in size and regulated by connecting channels. Apex Park, located at the southern end of First Reedy Lake, is a perfect location for picnics, swimming and fishing. The free RV camp area provides a great place for a short stay.

The Ibis Rookery and bird hide at Middle Reedy Lake is an ideal viewing platform to see the many waterbirds nesting in the shallow waters. Information shelters located at Lake Charm and Middle Reedy Lake provide interesting details on the region's wetlands and birdlife.

Lake Cullen is one of the largest lakes of the Kerang wetlands and is located on the shared floodplains of the Avoca and Loddon rivers. It is valued because of its size and unique environment and is used extensively by waterbirds to nest and forage.

The Avoca Marshes are a series of interconnecting natural wetlands that receive water when the Avoca River is in flood. Lake Bael Bael, located to the south, is a deep freshwater lake, while First Marsh is shallower and operates as an "occasional lake" with sparse vegetation growing across the wetland bed. Second and Third Marshes are shallow swamps containing thousands of dry standing red gums. These

wetlands fill during flood periods and operate in a wetting and drying cycle.

Salt lakes can also be spotted while driving through the lakes region. Lake Tutchewop, whose name is derived from indigenous Wamba Wamba language, is now a salt crusted basin, popular with birdwatchers.

The monument plague at Lake Tutchewop pays homage to its glory days as a popular swimming hole. In the right conditions, Lake Tutchewop offers magnificent opportunities to capture the vibrant mirrored reflections of the sunrise and sunset.



# CLOSE TO NATURE Gunbower Island and Murray River

The Murray River is one of Australia's greatest tourism destinations, stretching over 2,500kms in length. The Murray River forms the border between Victoria and New South Wales and flows into the sea at Lake Alexandrina in South Australia. It provides irrigation water to many farming communities, as well as providing important environmental flows to forests and wetlands. Thousands of camper's flock to the Murray River annually to camp and fish for the iconic Murray Cod. Access The Murray River can be accessed from our river towns. Koondrook and Murrabit, and via the Gunbower Forest near Cohuna.

Bordered by the Murray River is **Gunbower Island**, a 26,400-hectare floodplain extending from Koondrook to the Torrumbarry Weir, formed by the Gunbower Creek branching off the Murray River then re-joining downstream. Gunbower Island consists of two significant forest areas, the Gunbower National Park and Gunbower State Forest, and is the largest inland island in Australia. The ageless River Red Gum and Black Box forests of Gunbower Island were home to the local Indigenous people and their culture is evident in the various scar trees, cooking mounds and shell middens scattered throughout the forest.

Gunbower Island is the ideal destination for nature lovers and campers year-round with popular activities including bushwalking, camping, fishing, canoeing, mountain bike riding, bird watching and leisurely drives through the track network sightseeing. Wedge-tailed eagles, goannas, kangaroos and emus are common sights as you wander along the many tracks and trails.

Opportunities to discover Gunbower Island include taking a relaxing 5km self-guided paddle on the canoe trail at Safes Lagoon and finding historical, cultural and ecological sites along the Koondrook Red Gum Forest Walk. Alternatively, drive through the Gunbower State Forest past many indigenous, timber milling and early settler sites guided by the Spences Bridge Forest Drive informative CD. The CD is available to purchase from the Gateway to Gannawarra Visitor Centre in Cohuna or you can download free of charge from Soundcloud.

The wetlands of Gunbower Island are recognised as wetlands of international significance for their importance to birdlife, native mammals and amphibians. These wetlands are a haven for rare species such as the Broad Shelled Tortoise, Barking Marsh Frog and Platypus.

In 2016, Museum Victoria undertook a Bioscan on Gunbower Island where a team of specialist field biologists with the assistance of Barapa Land and Water, documented many species of wildlife across the waterways, wetlands and woodlands. The project marked 160 years since William Blandowski's expedition, where with the shared knowledge and skills of the local Indigenous people, he collected over 17,000 animal specimens for the museum. The **Murray Explored Bioscan** documentary video can be viewed on the Gannawarra or Museum Victoria websites.







### CLOSE TO NATURE Trails

Take your pick from the many local tracks and trails. Enjoy walking, cycling or mountain biking throughout the Gannawarra, while capturing the spectacular and contrasting surrounds on camera.

#### POPULAR WALKS AND TRAILS

- The **Koondrook Red Gum Forest Walk** is a relaxing walk through the majestic Gunbower State Forest. Both the Turtle Loop (13.2kms) and Eagle Loop (9.1kms) are marked with interpretative signage highlighting historical, cultural and ecological sites.
- The **Koondrook Barham Redgum Statue Walk** meanders along the banks of the Murray River and features 20 red gum statues of local identities and wildlife, carved by Kevin Guilders and Angela Polglaze and their chainsaws. Scan the QR code to view statue information.



- The Goanna Walking Track is a 3.2km looped track that crosses the Gunbower Creek via the red gum footbridge at Koondrook Retreat. The trail runs through the forest and crosses Condidorio's Bridge to lead back into the centre of town.
- The Loddon River Walk in Kerang Regional Park meanders through the relaxed woodland setting and along the levee. It is common to find birdlife in the wetland area of the park.
- See historic buildings and landmarks on a **Self Guided Walk or Drive of Historic Kerang.** Pick up a copy of the brochure from the Sir John Gorton Library in Kerang.
- In Cohuna, take the **Gunbower Island Walk** out to the Ski Run, follow the **Gilrule** Walking Track along the Gunbower Creek or discover historic buildings on the Cohuna Town Walk.
- Find birdlife, native flora and learn about local history on the leisurely 2.4km Cohuna Nature and Historical Walk starting at the Cohuna Weir.
- The Gunbower National Park and Gunbower State Forest offer an extensive network of tracks and trails suitable for walking and mountain bike riding.
- The Kerang Lakes provide many walking opportunities, including the Kangaroo Lake Walking Track along Gorton Drive and Lake **Charm Walking Loop** and artwork installation.
- Wander along the Avoca River Levee Walk in Quambatook.

# CLOSE TO NATURE Kayaking

From the open waters of the Kerang Lakes, to the discrete natural lagoons of Gunbower Island, the Gannawarra offers many unique paddling options for kayaking and stand-up paddleboarding adventures.

The Gunbower Island Canoe Trail on the Gunbower Creek is a leisurely 5km paddle through Safe's Lagoon. While paddling, see birds nesting in hollows of the standing dead trees, hear their calls and see the myriad of creatures living among the reeds and waters. The route to the canoe trail is signposted through the forest from Koondrook and offers a kayak launch for easy access into the creek.

Other popular kayak trails include Cohuna Town Lagoon, the Loddon River within Kerang Regional Park, Murray River, Avoca River, and Gunbower Creek along Koondrook Track.

Some kayak and canoe trails including Reedy Lagoon and Black Swamp are opportunistic, where they are only accessible due to flooding or high rainfall events.

Our comprehensive kayak and canoe brochure features information on all our trails, giving you several unique paddling options. Visit the Gateway to Gannawarra Visitor Centre for more information.

Kayak tours and rentals are available locally through Murray River Adventures. If serious about paddling, keep an eye out for The Massive Murray Paddle held annually.

# CLOSE TO NATURE Fishing

Native fish: Murray Cod, Yellow Belly (Golden Perch), and Bony Bream can be caught in the Murray River, Gunbower Creek, Loddon River and Avoca River, along with introduced species Redfin and Carp. Anglers can also fish in the Kerang Lakes and many channels throughout the region.


Many fishing competitions are held across the Gannawarra including the Murrabit Cod Challenge, Lake Charm Redfin Classic, Koondrook Barham Fishing Competition and Leitchville Bunyip Sporting Club Cod Closing Competition. See our website for events.

Fishing rods can be hired free from the Gateway to Gannawarra Visitor Centre in Cohuna, which also has handy information on boat ramp locations, where to fish, required licenses and regulations.

The Gannawarra supports the "catch and release" of native fish.







# CLOSE TO NATURE Birdwatching

The wetlands provide valuable habitats for the many species of waterbirds found in the Gannawarra with Kerang Lakes and Gunbower National Park both recognised as wetlands of international significance under the Ramsar Convention.

The Ibis Rookery at Middle Reedy Lake is the largest rookery in the Southern Hemisphere, where each spring, thousands of ibis flock to the area to breed. The bird hide is best visited at dawn and dusk and offers viewers the perfect place to watch Straw-necked and White Ibis, along with other spectacular birds such as Pelicans, Swans, Spoonbills and Egrets.

Lake Cullen is one of the largest lakes in the Kerang wetlands sitting on the shared floodplains of the Avoca and Loddon rivers. It is the only intermittent saline wetland within the Kerang Ramsar site and due to its large size and unique environment provides ideal foraging for waterbirds. Fifty-six species of waterbird have been observed at Lake Cullen. The sighting and photography of endangered species, the Australasian Bittern, has reinforced the significance of the Kerang Wetlands in fauna conservation.

Lake Tutchewop is also proving to be an important birdwatching destination, with the arrival of the Long-billed Dowitcher some years back, which created serious excitement for twitchers.

Other wetlands popular for birdwatching include the Avoca Marshes, Kerang Regional Park, Lake Bael Bael, Lake Murphy, Hird Swamp and Johnson Swamp.

As a permanent body of water, Gunbower Creek, and the many lagoons within Gunbower Island, provide vital habitats for numerous species. Environmental water inflows into Reedy **Lagoon** have provided a special place for birdwatching, as the rich environment provides excellent feeding and breeding opportunities for species.

Over 82 different species of birds have been identified in the area such as the Royal Spoonbill, Intermediate Egret, Caspian Tern, Pied Cormorant, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Azure Kingfisher, and many others, some considered threatened species.

The Wedge-tailed Eagle, Tawny Frogmouth, Kookaburra and a variety of parrots are also commonly seen across the Gannawarra.

### **INDUSTRY IN** the Gannawarra

#### **Innovative Agriculture**

The Gannawarra benefits from a diverse agricultural sector and is supported by modernised irrigation systems suited to a range of agricultural activities including dairy, cropping and horticulture.



The strength of the local dairy sector in Cohuna and Leitchville is widely recognised. It is likely the area will see the development of large-scale shedded robotic dairy operations along with large-scale poultry and piggery farms utilising the broadacre feed production.

Dryland cropping is using technology and modern farming practices to maintain production amid a dryer and changing climate. New crops such as wine grapes, medicinal cannabis, organic grain, stone fruit, and organic processing tomatoes are being grown on subsurface irrigation and are realising above average production figures.

#### **Renewable Energy**

The Gannawarra is a leader in the development of renewable energy projects. With largescale solar farms already in operation, the Gannawarra is seen as a key location in the growth of renewable energy.

The announcement of the VNI West electricity interconnector will further see the Gannawarra as a key destination for large-scale solar projects, battery storage projects and wind farms.

The VNI West project will enable approved renewable energy projects to proceed, in what is a "game changer" for the Gannawarra. This project will set up north-west Victoria as the primary renewable energy zone nationally.

#### **Industrial and Manufacturing**

The Gannawarra boasts well-serviced industrial estates in Kerang, Cohuna and Koondrook, where major manufacturing businesses are expanding and providing new employment opportunities.

Industrial estates in the Gannawarra are a major source of investment and employment. For example, Tate Drive Industrial Estate businesses in Kerang employs around 150 people and has generated around \$20 million of investment. Demand for land is relatively strong and growth from within the industrial sector is positive.




